“very & Extremely angry”***

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The word very is often used in front of the term angry. Use these phrases instead of saying “very angry”.

Enraged adj /ɪn'reɪdʒd/

very angry, furious.

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Furious adj /'fjʊəriəs/

Extremely angry, violent, or intense.

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Seething adj /'si:ðɪŋ/

Feeling extremely angry without showing it much.

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Infuriated adj /ɪn'fjʊəriət/

make someone extremely angry and impatient.

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Livid adj /'lɪvɪd/

Furiously angry.

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Irate adj /ɪ'reɪt/

Feeling or characterized by great anger.

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Apoplectic adj /,apə'plektɪk/

Overcome with anger.

Murderous adj /'mɜːd(ə)rəs/

Extremely arduous or unpleasant.

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Incensed adj /ɪn'sɛnst/

Extremely angry.

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Incandescent adj /ɪnkan'des(ə)nt/

Emitting light as a result of being heated.

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Outraged

verb /'aʊtreɪdʒ/

arouse fierce anger, shock, or indignation.

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Steaming adj /'stiːmɪŋ/

Giving off steam, Extremely angry.

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Seething adj /'si:ðɪŋ/

intense but unexpressed anger.

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At the end of your rope

a state in which one is not able to deal with a problem.

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Breathing fire

to be very angry about something.

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Fierce adj /fɪəs/

having or displaying an intense or ferocious aggressiveness.

Fiercely adj /'fɪəsli/

in a savagely violent or aggressive manner.

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Hopping bad

Extremely disappointed.

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Ropable adj /'rəʊpəb(ə)l/

Angry, furious, in a bad temper.

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Wrathful adj /'rɒθfʊl, 'rɒθf(ə)l, 'rɔ:θfʊl, 'rɔ:θf(ə)l/

full of or characterized by intense anger.

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Splenetic adj /splɪ'netɪk/

Bad temper, spiteful.

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Sick to your stomach

feeling very upset, worried, or angry.
