

Phrasal Verbs Related to COOKING



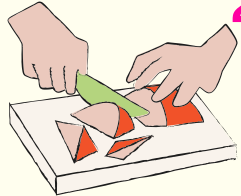
1. Boil over



- Meaning: When liquid overflows.
- Example: The milk boiled over quickly.



2. Chop up



- Meaning: Cut into small pieces.
- Example: Please chop up the vegetables finely.

3. Cook up



- Meaning: Prepare food quickly.
- Example: She cooked up a delicious pasta dish.

4. Cut back on



- Meaning: Reduce the amount.
- Example: You should cut back on sugar in tea.

5. Cut out



- Meaning: Remove completely.
- Example: Cut out the unhealthy snacks for dinner.

6. Dish out



- Meaning: Serve food to people.
- Example: She dished out soup for everyone at dinner.

7. Eat up



- Meaning: Finish all your food.
- Example: Eat up your dinner before it gets cold!

8. Fry up



- Meaning: Cook by frying.
- Example: I'll fry up some eggs for breakfast.



Phrasal Verbs Related to COOKING



9. Heat up



- **Meaning:** Warm food again.
- **Example:** Can you heat up the leftover pizza?

10. Whip up



- **Meaning:** Make food quickly.
- **Example:** I can whip up a salad in ten minutes.



11. Mix in



- **Meaning:** Combine ingredients.
- **Example:** Mix in the spices thoroughly for the sauce.

12. Pour in



- **Meaning:** Add liquid to something.
- **Example:** Pour in the milk slowly while stirring.

13. Stir in



- **Meaning:** Mix by stirring.
- **Example:** Stir in the sugar until it dissolves.

14. Set out



- **Meaning:** Arrange food to serve.
- **Example:** The host set out snacks for the guests.

15. Turn down



- **Meaning:** Reduce heat or power.
- **Example:** Turn down the flame to simmer the soup.

16. Turn up



- **Meaning:** Increase heat or power.
- **Example:** Turn up the oven to 200 degrees.
